He came to Taylor in 2007 after serving 10 years as Executive Director of Central Michigan Youth for Christ. He holds an M.A. in Philanthropic Studies from Indiana University's Lilly Family School of Philanthropy and Ed.D. in Higher Education Leadership from Regent University. His dissertation addressed Advancement's Role in Enhancing Financial Viability of Christian Colleges.



#### **WILL HAGEN**

Will Hagen currently serves at Moderna as Director, Leadership and Culture Business Partner. Will previously worked for Taylor University as Vice President for Strategy and Chief of Staff, where he helped lead the University's strategic planning and implementation work, staff the Board of Trustees, facilitate the work of the President's Office and Cabinet, provide strategic leadership for People Operations and Institutional Research, and lead a wide variety of initiatives on behalf of the President. He holds a B.A. in English Language and Literature and an M.S. in Financial Analysis, both from Gordon College, and he is pursuing his doctorate from Vanderbilt University's Peabody College.



#### **MICHAEL LINDSAY**

Michael Lindsay, Ph.D., serves as the President of Taylor University. Chuck serves as the vice chairman for Canterbury School and is on the board of the Boys and Girls Club of Greater Northeast Indiana, the Fort Wayne Children's Zoo (past Chair), Love Fort Wayne (past Chair), and the Fort Wayne Philharmonic Orchestra (past Chair). #### **DR. LARRY TAYLOR**

Dr. Larry Taylor serves as the President and CEO of the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI). Prior to assuming leadership at ACSI, Dr. Taylor served for 20 years as the Head of School at Prestonwood Christian Academy (PCA) in Plano, Texas. Dr. Taylor previously served as President of the Texas Private Schools Association (TPSA) Board of Directors. Dr. Taylor also served for 12 years at The First Academy in Orlando, Florida as a high school principal and assistant headmaster. He also has held teaching positions within the public-school system. Dr. Taylor co-launched a national training

institute for schools, "Becoming a Kingdom School Institute" and founded the Student Leadership Institute (SLI) program. He developed a training program for parents called, "Becoming a Kingdom Family." Dr. Taylor published the book titled *Running With the Horses*, which helps parents raise children to be servant-leaders for Christ and helps to build a family plan. Dr. Taylor has been married to Delinda Rose Taylor for 35 years and has five sons: Bryce, Luke, Zeke, Chas, and DeMarcus.



#### **DAPHNA TOBEY**
